ADMISSION UNDER SENATE BILL 1528

UNT Dallas is dedicated to helping students and families in the pursuit of their educational goals. According to the passing of Senate Bill 1528 (SB 1528, effective September 1, 2006), Texas law allows students that are neither U.S. citizens nor Lawful Permanent Residents to be classified as a Texas resident for admissions and financial aid purposes.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Must have graduated from a Texas high school or received the equivalent of a high school diploma (e.g. GED) in the state of Texas; and
- 2. Must have resided continuously in the state of Texas for the three years preceding the date of graduation from high school or the receipt of the diploma equivalent; and
- Must have resided or will have resided in Texas for the 12 months preceding the census date of the academic term in which the person is enrolled in an institution of higher education; and
- 4. Must provide the attached notarized affidavit* stating that:

"I will apply to become a permanent resident of the United States as soon as I become eligible to apply."

NEXT STEPS:

- 1. Complete and submit an UNT Dallas application for admission.
- 2. Submit official high school transcript or diploma equivalent certificate, as applicable.
- 3. Complete and submit attached *notarized* affidavit as described above to UNT Dallas Office of Undergraduate Admissions via mail or in-person delivery.
