## RECOMMENDED COURSE SEQUENCE NOTES

15 credit hours per fall and spring semester or 30 hours over a full academic year is typically required to graduate with a 120-hour undergraduate degree in 4 years.

<sup>1</sup> Even if summer courses are not listed or recommended, students can use the summer sessions to take courses to continue progress to degree attainment. Refer to the course descriptions of the Undergraduate Catalog for information related to course offerings typical for each term and the posted schedule of classes in myUNT.D.

<sup>2</sup> Communication Core – recommend ENGL 1313 (TCCN: ENGL 1301) and ENGL 1323 (TCC: ENGL 1302). Requires grades of C or better in Communication Core.

<sup>3</sup> Required for the major concentration.

<sup>4</sup> EMSA elective – any 3000 or 4000 level EMSA course at UNT Dallas.

<sup>5</sup> Occupational credit - To enter this program, students must be certified professional fire fighter, EMT or paramedic. Up to 46 hours of transfer credit from the community college related to workforce credit from Fire Science or Emergency Medical Services or Paramedic programs is accepted toward the degree.

<sup>6</sup> The BAAS degree is a highly flexible plan that allows students to utilize college and workforce credit from transfer and/or configure a customized plan from UNTD credit. Students must work closely with an academic advisor to develop a plan that maximizes students' credits and interests.
