- II. Role/Expectations of Faculty Senators
  - a. When the Faculty Senate was formed, each school received one senator for every 15 faculty members. The faculty in each school were divided among the senators to provide each senator with their own list of faculty to communicate with. Janiece wants to return to the practice where every senator has a list of faculty members they regularly communicate with and receive feedback from.

- b. Otteson: Do we have an updated email list.
  - i. Got a count from the Deans and should get a list in the next couple of weeks.
- c. Sanders: Is there a possibility to having a Canvas shell for communication constituents. This way the Senate does contribute to the email overload.

membership of the Senate body, but all nominations must have a second affirming vote from another current Senator."

The composition of each committee shall be comprised of one member of the Faculty Senate as an ex-officio member and be representative of the composition of the Faculty Senate as a whole.

Hello President von Eschenbach,

I just received the newly drafted FS charter back from the OGC. Faculty Senate voted to approve and present the charter to you, contingent upon any changes suggested by OGC. Although there were slight changes in wording and a few consistency corrections, no major alterations were suggested. I've made all the changes recommended by OGC. (There are several differences from the first draft I showed you.)

The new Senate, as spelled out in the charter, will have a Faculty Senator appointed by you from each of the Schools and Colleges. The remaining Faculty Senators will be elected by the Schools and Colleges. Elected senators will represent the Schools and Colleges, as well as rank, and four at-large positions.

Of special interest in the charted is Article IV, Section 4 - regarding the appointment cycle of officers. FS will appoint one of the at-large members as Parliamentarian and vote to endorse 3 candidates from the remaining at-large representatives to present to you for review and possible appointment as Executive Officers. (If they are not appointed, they will simply remain as at-large representatives.)

Once you approve the charter (hopefully before the Sept. 1<sup>st</sup> deadline), the new UNTD Faculty Senate will be up and running. To be honest, I am not sure what formality has to happen regarding your approval. Is that an email? Do you need to inform anyone? I'm sure there needs to be something in writing???

(Also of interest in the charter, the current President, VP, and Secretary, and Parliamentary will move to at-large members - making way for the appt. of Parliamentarian and the endorsement of candidates to present to you for review.)

Also, I will send you a list this week of candidates interested in representing each of the 4 Schools and College of Law for your review and possible appointment.



**Faculty Senate Bylaws** Article I. Purposes, Adoptions and Transparency Section 1. Purposes Paragraph 1. The purpose of these Bylaws is to state the manner in which the provisions of the Charter of the Faculty Senate of UNT Dallas shall be applied to the functioning of the Faculty Senate and its committees. Article II. Faculty Senate Meetings and Quorum Section 1.Regular Meetings Paragraph1. Regular meetings should be held once a month, from September to May. Section 2. Agenda Paragraph 1. The agenda shall be determined by the President in consultation with the Executive Committee, as informed by recommendations of the General Membership. Section 3. Public Comment Paragraph 1. Members of the public may address the Faculty Senate regarding items listed on the meeting agenda. Paragraph 2. Public comment will be allowed prior to the discussion of each agenda item. The presiding officer will invite registered speakers to comment before the Senate begins deliberation on the item. Paragraph 3. Each speaker will be allotted up to three (3) minutes to present their comments. Time limits will be enforced to ensure orderly and efficient meetings. Paragraph 4. individuals wishing to speak must register in advance by emailing: facultysenate@untdallas.edu. Registration must be received at least 24 hours prior to the scheduled meeting time. Paragraph 5. Comments must be relevant to the agenda item. Speakers must address their comment to the Presiding Officer, not to other members or to the audience.

Speakers must maintain decorum and avoid personal attacks.

45 46 Paragraph 6. The Faculty Senate does not engage in dialogue during public comment 47 periods but may refer matters for future consideration. 48 49 Paragraph 7. The Senate reserves the right to adopt additional reasonable, viewpoint-50 neutral rules to manage public comment. 51 52 Section 4. Decisions of the Faculty Senate 53 54 Paragraph 1. A quorum shall be a simple majority of the voting members. 55 56 Paragraph 2. Voting may be by show of hands, voice vote, e-mail, other electronic 57 means, or secret ballot. 58 59 Paragraph 3. Proxy voting shall not be permitted. 60 61 Paragraph 4. The President will cast tie-breaking votes (as necessary). 62 63 64 Article III. Faculty Senate Voting Rules and Procedures 65 66 Section 1. Presumption of record votes 67 68 Paragraph 1. All votes on Faculty Senate business shall be accompanied by a written 69 record of Senator names and votes. 70 71 Article IV. Faculty Senate Committee Rules and Procedures 72 73 Section 1. Standing Committees 74 75 Paragraph 1. The Committee on Academic Affairs shall study and make 76 recommendations to the Faculty Senate on university policy concerning admission 77 standards, suspension, probation, and dismissal of students for academic reasons; 78 standards for graduation; the awarding of honors to graduates; and any other academic 79 concerns that may be assigned by the Faculty Senate. The Committee shall make 80 recommendations regarding all academic degree programs, certificates, and core 81 curriculum courses. The Committee shall monitor developments regarding individual 82 courses and curriculum of all degree programs in the university. 83 84 Paragraph 2. The Committee on Work-Life shall make recommendations to the Faculty 85 Senate on policies related to recruitment, retention, promotion, merit, evaluation, tenure, compensation, workload, and working conditions for all faculty members. 86 87 88 Paragraph 3. The Committee on the Library shall advocate for appropriate levels of 89 library funding and resource distribution, and track policies and procedures of the 90 library. The Committee shall identify areas of change/improvement for the library and 91 offer suggestions and report on any matters of the library concerning the 92 implementation of its recommendations, to include the needs of the library and how

these may be of interest to the university community as a whole.

Paragraph 4. The Committee on Nominations and Elections shall conduct nomination and election processes of faculty to Faculty Senate. The President and Vice President/President-Elect may not serve as a member of the Committee on Nominations and Elections. Nominations and Elections are subject to Senate ratification.

Paragraph 5. The Committee on Charter and Bylaws shall be responsible for Charter and Bylaws for the Senate, consider amendments, and may be called upon to draft Senate resolutions.

Paragraph 6. The Committee on the Faculty Handbook shall be responsible for reviewing all aspects of the UNT Dallas Faculty Handbook, and together with the Office of the Provost, will ensure that information in the Faculty Handbook is aligned with University Policies.

Paragraph 7. The Committee on the Annual Administrator Advisory Review shall be responsible for conducting, analyzing, and disseminating an annual review of the university administration from the members of the faculty. University administration includes President, Provost, and Deans for the purposes of this committee.

Paragraph 8. The time, place, and notice of any meetings of any committee will be determined by that committee chair, in consultation with its members. At meetings of any committee, a majority of the members of that committee constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business, and the act of a majority of the entire committee will be the act of the committee. Each committee will keep regular recorded minutes of its proceedings for record and report them to the Faculty Senate Secretary. Any action required or permitted to be taken at any meeting of a committee may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing setting forth the action taken, is signed by all the members of the committee. Such consent will have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote at a duly called and held meeting of the committee.

### Section 2. Duties - Standing Committee Chairs

Paragraph 1. Chairs of the various Standing Committees shall establish committee agendas and procedures and lead meetings. Committee Chairs shall report committee recommendations to the Faculty Senate, to include an annual written report. Committee Chairs may be authorized to establish attendance policies (no more stringent than the attendance policy for Senators) and keep a record of attendance.

## Section 3. Terms - Standing Committee Chairs.

Paragraph 1. Each Standing Committee Chair shall serve for a one-year term. Committee Chairs may be reelected for an additional year resulting in a maximum of a two-year term.

141	Paragraph 2. Standing Committee Chairs must meet eligibility standards of a duly
142	elected Member of the Faculty Senate. Standing Committee Chairs may not be an
143	Executive Officer of the Faculty Senate or have exceeded the maximum two-year term
144	in any consecutive four-year period (for a specific Committee).
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146	Section 4. Duties - Committee Membership.
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148	Paragraph 1. Committee members are expected to attend meeting regularly and/or
149	provide meaningful contributions to the committee's business.

151	Paragraph 2. If a committee member fails to adhere to Paragraph 1, the committee may
152	request the Faculty Senate remove the committee member or to revoke the use of
153	committee membership toward service credit.

155	Section 5. Terms for committee appointments

157	Paragraph 1. All standing committee members are appointed from the voting members
158	of the general membership for three-year terms.
