Nomination Form for 2023 Faculty Senate Elections

Nominations for Faculty Senate positions may be made by any eligible voting member of the Faculty Senate as set forth in Faculty Senate Charter and Bylaws, Article II, Section 3. The voting members of the General Membership must meet all of the following conditions: hold a full-time faculty appointment or be a full-time visiting faculty member at UNT Dallas; receive at least 50% of their salary during the academic year (faculty members on sabbatical or other leave who are not receiving at least 50% of their annual salary do not have voting privileges); and may not hold an administrative appointment above the rank of Program Coordinator, Program Director, Program Chair, or Department Chair

Candidates may only run for one position per election. For more information on elections, see Faculty Senate Charter and Bylaws, Article IV, Section 5.

Nominations may be made for the following positions:

- Vice-President/President-Elect
- Parliamentarian/Secretary-Elect
- Senator, Tenure-Track
- Senator, Business Place Two
- Senator, Education
- Senator, Liberal Arts & Sciences Place One
- Senator, Liberal Arts & Sciences Place Two

The President and Vice-President/President-Elect must hold a full-time appointment at UNT Dallas as a tenured faculty member or a permanent nontenured track faculty with a multi-year contract.

All positions must meet and maintain the qualifications of any voting members of the General Membership (see above).
