Completed PhD in Sociology at the University of North Texas in Denton, Texas in 2006. Areas of specialty include sociological theory, social psychology, ethnic identity, gender identity, race relations, sports sociology, and research methods. Dissertation entitled Ethnic Identity of Mexican American Children in the Post-Industrial Age studied the ethnic identity of Mexican American children. The study was a modification of the Kenneth and Mamie Clark's "Brown doll/White doll" experiment using a mixed-model approach, applying both quantitative and qualitative research methods.

Taught classes in Sociology since 1995 at four different institutions before University of North Texas at Dallas: Sul Ross State University, Navarro College, Our Lady of the Lake University, and Southern Methodist University.
