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Course Goals or Overview:

The objective of the course is to teach students how to approach project management and understand all the essential concepts from both a theoretical and applied perspective. This course provides a comprehensive overview of Project Management methods - without focusing on a specific methodology - providing a sound base of knowledge for project managers to work from. Students will learn some of the techniques utilized in practice by project managers.

Course Objective:

At the end of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1) define what a project is what are the critical aspects of project management
- 2) Determine risk projects are exposed to and quantify risks probability
- 3) Estimate Project Times & Costs from the work breakdown structure
- 4) Schedule a project by identifying, sequencing, and estimating the duration of each activity
- 5) Assign resources to activities to identify resource overloads and how to handle it
- 6) Estimate the cost of a project and demonstrate an understanding of cost control techniques

GRADED ELEMENTS DETAILS

- 1. QUIZ (25 %): Quizzes for the assigned chapters open at 6:00AM of the day assigned in the syllabus, and will close at 11.59 PM the following day. The time assigned for the quiz is 10 minutes. One attempt is allowed on the quiz. You should pay particular attention to the key learning objectives of the chapters. All examination and quiz questions will be linked to the learning objectives.
- 2. EXAMS (70%): There will be two exams. The exams will be online. Referring to the syllabus for the exam date. Exam opens at 6:00 AM of the day assigned in the syllabus and will close at 11.00 PM the following day. The time assigned for the exam is 1:30 hours. One attempt is allowed on the exam. The exams will consist of questions drawn from the readings, lectures, speakers, presentations, and out-of-class assignments. You are responsible for the material even if it is not emphasized or covered during the lectures. The exams will emphasize the material identified in my objectives for each chapter or topic. There will be no make-up exams except in extraordinary situations that require approval before the scheduled exam. The exams are not cumulative; however, you must be familiar with basic concepts covered earlier in the class.
- 3. ONLINE PARTICIPATION (5 %) Questions will be posted on the discussion board by Professor Mitra and students are expected to contribute answers and discussion to the topic.
