Texas 6-Drop Limit Appeal Form

Texas Education Code 51.907 mandates that students who enroll in a Texas public higher education institution as a first-time freshman in Fall 2007 or any term subsequent to the Fall 2007 term may withdraw from a total of six courses. The 6-drop limit includes any course a transfer student has withdrawn from at another Texas public higher education institution. This rule does not apply to courses dropped prior to the Census Date and does not apply if the student withdraws from all courses for the term.

Requests for exception to the 6-drop limit must be made by completing this form and providing supporting documentation to the student's academic dean and must occur during the semester that the withdrawn course(s) were completed.
